So now is your chance - whether you are a teacher, school, student, parent or anyone involved in education - to highlight the effectiveness of what you/they do and receive recognition for it.



Award Categories

Learner of the Year

This award will recognise a learner of any age who can demonstrate a commitment to their own personal and professional development through learning. They should show that training and education has made a real difference to their life by improving their skills or qualifications. The learner may have overcome particular obstacles to succeed.

Early Years Award

This award will go to an innovative and successful child-minding provider, nursery, school or organisation which stands out from the rest for their early years support or provision. They should be able to clearly demonstrate the impact their work has had on their users or the children in their care.

Community Involvement Award

The judges will be looking for an organisation or scheme which has really benefitted its community and beyond. The winner could be a parents association supporting their school; a school raising money for charity or an innovative scheme building bridges between communities.

Technology in Learning

This award will go to an organisation or partnership which can demonstrate how the creative and innovative use of technology has had a positive impact on learning and teaching.

Teaching Assistant of the Year

The winner will be a teaching assistant who makes an outstanding contribution to the life of a nursery, school or college.

Support Staff of the Year

An award for a member of support staff, or a team of support staff, who always give exceptional service and make a real difference to their educational establishment through their work.

Innovation in the Arts Award

This award will go to an organisation or educational establishment which can demonstrate a commitment to providing opportunities in the arts to its members or students. The winners will show they are not only raising standards in the arts but allowing students to fulfil their potential through exciting, innovative and creative projects. Appropriate areas could include dance, drama, visual arts, music, crafts, photography or creative writing.

Fit for Life Award

Awarded to an educational establishment which demonstrates an outstanding commitment to both encouraging students to be active on a regular basis with a wide participation in sports and other physical pursuits i.e. Youth Clubs, after school clubs and achieving success in those activities.

Outstanding New Teacher

An award for a teacher who has been in the profession for less than two years but has already shown outstanding promise in the classroom

Teacher/Lecturer of the Year

This award will recognise a teacher or lecturer who inspires and engages students to fulfil their potential and makes an exceptional contribution to the life of their school, college or university.

Headteacher / Principal of the Year


This award will go to an inspirational headteacher or principal who has shown exceptional management and teaching skills and commitment to their school, college or university.















Award Categories

Award for Youth

This award will go to someone who has demonstrated outstanding commitment and enthusiasm while working with young people in Essex. The winner could be an individual volunteer, coach, leader or paid youth worker involved with organisations such as guiding and scouting, faith groups, sports teams, youth clubs, etc. Team entries will also be considered.

Apprentice of the Year

This award will go to an apprentice who has completed an apprenticeship within the last academic year (2014/15) or is working towards an apprenticeship. Judges will be looking for apprentices who have made outstanding progress in both their practical work and in their studies, and who has made an exceptional contribution to their workplace.

College, University or Post-18 Education & Training Provider of the Year

An award for an employer, education establishment or training organisation which has shown exceptional commitment to education, training and learning for their students or employees. The judges will be looking for nominations which can

demonstrate commitment to further and continuing education and a range of training opportunities available to learners aged 16 and above.

Special Education Needs (SENCO) Award

This award will go to a teacher, department or organisation providing exceptional support for those with special needs or disabilities.

School Personality of the Year

Awarded to the person in recognition of their outstanding personality and enthusiastic approach. A popular personality within the school. The winner could be a cook, caretaker or midday supervisor etc.

Primary School of the Year Award

This award will go to an exceptional primary school which stands out from the rest. Has your school shone with outstanding achievements? Have you made improvements and seen great results? Using evidence to support your case, tell us the secrets of your success. Was it down to innovative ways of working; parental involvement; pure determination - or something else? However you did it, If you believe your school deserves this award for 2014-15, then we want to know.

Secondary School of the Year Award

This award will go to an exceptional secondary school which stands out from the rest. Not only do we want to see academic achievement we also want the entries to demonstrate innovation, imagination and efforts to develop children in ways that go beyond the league tables. You should provide evidence to support your application, be it Ofsted reports, parent testimonials, data analysis or anything else you feel would be relevant.

The Gazette -Lifetime Achievement Award

This prestigious award will go to someone who, in the view of the judges, has had a significant and positive impact on education in North Essex over a period of years. There will be no shortlist published for this award and only the winner will be invited to the presentation event.


The judges will be looking at the quality of the nomination received rather than the quantity for one nominee. However, if a large number of nominations are received they will take this into account.















FAQs

Who can make a nomination?

We would encourage everyone who has contact with schools to think about submitting an application form. Nominations can be made by anyone - headteachers, teachers, classroom assistants, parents, governors, pupils, businesses and employers working with schools, and the general public - simply by completing the application form by post or online.

Who can be nominated?

The Education Awards are open to all North Essex government funded and independent private educational establishments including primary, secondary and special needs schools. Registered childminders, nurseries and those linked with education, whether a football coach, youth club leader or brownie leader etc, can all be put forwarded for these awards.

Do I have to ask permission before nominating a school or teacher?

No, we will check with headteachers in schools if the nomination gets to the final stages.

Where can I make the nomination?

Do I need to send anything else in or provide evidence?

Our experienced judging panel will make decisions based on the information provided on your nomination form. You may send up to six A4 sheets of additional information included with the entry form. We can also accept brochures or dvds as supporting material.

How much work is involved in nominating someone?

All you need to do is complete both the nomination form and upload your Word document/photos online or post your nomination to Kelly Roast at the address above.

How many nominations can I make?


You can make as many nominations as you wish. Please note however that nominations will be sifted, and finalists short-listed based on the content of the nominations rather than the number of nominations received.















FAQs

What happens next after I have nominated?

Once nominations close, on July 24, all entries will be assessed by a panel of judges against the relevant category criteria. From this, nominations will be shortlisted in each category. Following the completion of the judging process, the judges will determine the winner and two runners up in each category. At this stage the three finalists in each category and representatives of their school will be informed and invited along to the final awards ceremony.

Who organises and sponsors them?

The Awards are organised by Newsquest Essex Limited, publishers of several local newspapers which include the Essex County Standard and Gazette, as well as digital websites and events. Each category is sponsored by a local business within the area.

How are they judged?

An independent panel of expert judges will select the winners for each of the Awards.

Please note: The judges' decision is final. The judges will place an entry in a more appropriate category if they think it is applicable. The organisers reserve the right to change deadline dates and categories as appropriate. Entries will not be returned.

When will the winners be announced?

Winners will be announced at a gala event to be held at The Colchester Community Stadium on Friday November 6, 2015.

The black-tie gala event, which will be open to anyone who wishes to attend, will include reception, three course dinner including table wine, awards presentation ceremony, entertainment throughout and followed by a disco and charity auction.




